Q: What is a NP-Led clinic?

A: The NP-led clinic model in Ontario is focused on comprehensive all ages primary health care. These clinics are funded by the provincial government.

Here is the design of the NP-led clinic:

- 1) A not for profit incorporation with a governing board - 51% of board members are NPs (the 51% is to minimize risk of deviation from the NP perspective although this is not government policy).
- 2) A clinical lead who is an NP.
- 3) 4-6 NPs who are the primary care providers for patients.
- 4) An interprofessional team based on needs of the patient population including a family physician (the role is not as a traditional FP - it is as a consulting specialist FP). Other team members may include a dietician, pharmacist, nurse, social worker, etc.
- 5) An administrative lead.
